Language of Instruction	<p>All modules are delivered in English - Applicants should be at 6.0/6.5 IELTS standard (dependent on Faculty and programme)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students coming for the fall semester only are able to provide a signed letter from the home institution indicating proficiency according to a minimum level of CEFR B2. Students coming on exchange for the full academic year will need to demonstrate proficiency through an approved provider as per UK Visas and Immigration standards. The full list of accepted tests can be found here. Please note, these tests need to have been issued within the last two years. <p>DMU also accept the following as evidence of English Language Proficiency (the below do not have a validity period so can be issued prior to the last two years):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Pearson English Language Test (PTE Academic) - with a minimum overall score of 50, with at least 42 in each component. Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) IBT – with a minimum overall score of 60 and at least the following for each component: Reading: 13, Writing: 21, Speaking: 18, Listening: 12 Cambridge English (First Certificate) with Grade B, minimum score of 169 Cambridge ESOL Level 1– equivalent to CEFR B2 IELTS – minimum score 6 with at least 5.5 in each component. <p>DMU also offer an English language test for incoming students to determine their language level. This can only be requested at the application stage. This is currently free of charge due to the pandemic but maybe chargeable in future. Further details are available here.</p> <p>A list of those exempt from demonstrating this evidence can be found here.</p>

Accommodation and Student Support	
Accommodation	All exchange students at DMU are guaranteed accommodation at our Castle Court halls of residence if they complete their application before the given deadline.
Exchange Student Support	Exchange students can benefit from services such as international welcome week , airport pick-ups and a ‘buddies’ scheme which matches students with a current DMU student.
Faculty Support	Each faculty has its own Student Advice Centre , the first point of call for all learning support enquiries. They help with IT, lending equipment and signposting to other departments.
Disability & Mental Health Support	Our Disability Advice and Support (DAS) Team and Mental Health Inclusion Team are to help all students before and during their time at DMU.

Visa and immigration	
Autumn/fall exchange	Students can stay in the UK without a visa if studying for 6 months or less with the visitor rules. Individuals who are visa nationals (see Appendix 2), have a criminal record or have previously been refused entry into the UK will need to apply for a Standard Visitor visa . Students can find out whether a visa is required and the rules pertaining to Visitor rules or the Standard Visitor visa here .
Full year exchange	Students studying in the UK for 6 months or longer will need to apply for a visa under the Student route as part of the points-based system. Students will require a CAS letter from DMU which will be provided after the student's application has been approved. Individuals will need to demonstrate that they meet specific requirements. More information about fees, documentation and rules regarding this route can be found here .
