Language of instruction	French : Minimum required level of TFI 750, DELF B2 English : Solely in business administration as well as English literature and linguistics
French-language test	BCI : the result of a test must be attached to the student's file certifying that he has the required level. Bilateral agreements : For non-francophone institutions: if no test results are provided, your students will be required to take the French online test from Université Laval's École de langues (ELUL).
French as a foreign language	If your students do not have the required level of French, they can take courses in French as a foreign language during the summer session, or even during the fall or winter session The School of languages charges activity fees for Français langue étrangère (FLE) level courses.

Confirmation of course selection at Laval at the beginning of the session, subject to course availability and program director approval. Students wishing to take a language course must take a placement test before the start of the session. Places in these classes <u>are limited</u> .

Nomination <u>BCI program</u>	1. Institution have to send us a file containing the name of the students selected and the program chosen by email no later than March 1st, 2022 at : etudiantsentrants@bi.ulaval.ca 2. Once we receive this information, we will verify if it is consistent to the BCI program (no more than 6 nominations by institution) and, if so, we will send a link to an online form to your students. If it is not, we will inform the partner institution.																				
Application deadlines	Nominated students have 7 days to complete their application form.																				
Recommended arrival date	One week before the beginning of classes.																				
Student card and Student ID	Each student will receive a student card and an email address. The student card gives access to the Sports Complex (PEPS), library , etc.																				
Accommodation / Housing options	On campus residence halls: A limited number of rooms are reserved for exchange students. Students admitted will receive a special reservation form with their application form. We recommend that they wait to receive confirmation of their admission prior to booking their room. Please note that the leases are for 8 months, and students who come for only one session will end their lease as stated in their contract.
