

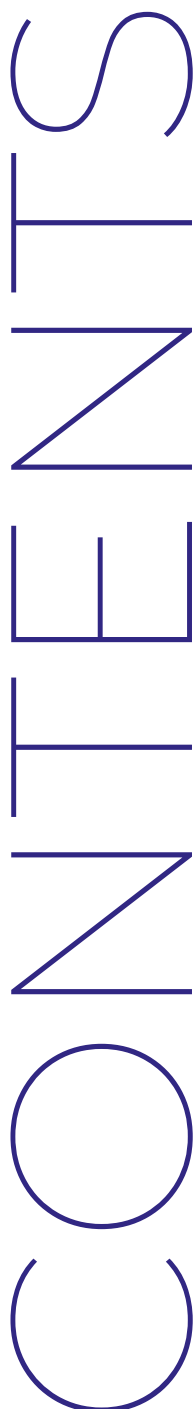

LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

Since we are experiencing a huge increase in incoming students, we are planning new substantial updates for future academic years.

*Starting from the **Academic Year 2024-2025**, we will require the following certifications of language proficiency:*

B2 level

English language

To be admitted and attend English-taught courses

B2 level

Italian language

To be admitted and attend Italian-taught courses belonging to the Bachelor's degrees in **Interpreting and Communication** and **Languages, Culture and Digital Communication**, and the Master's degree in **Specialized Translation and Conference Interpreting**

B1 level

Italian language

To be admitted and attend Italian-taught courses belonging to all the remaining Bachelor's and Master's degrees held in Italian

We accept both international language certifications and home university official declarations, as far as they explicitly certify the exact level possessed by the student.

NOMINATION & APPLICATION PROCEDURES

Students will be nominated by their home university through an **online Nomination Form** that will be sent by email to partners. Students' **language proficiency certifications** must be uploaded during the Nomination process.

Students will receive instructions to complete their **online Application Form** on the email address indicated during the Nomination process.

Before starting filling in the Application form, students will have to prepare and then upload the following documents:

- **Jpeg photo** (ID/Passport format)
- PDF of **Passport** (for non-EU students) or **ID card** (for EU students)
- PDF of **Academic records in English** (Official Transcript of Records)
- PDF of **European Health Card** (for EU students) or a **private Health insurance** (for non-EU students)

APPLICATION 1st / Fall semester Full year	from May 13th, 2024	to June 13th, 2024
NOMINATION 2nd / Spring semester	from September 11th, 2024	to October 11th, 2024
APPLICATION 2nd / Spring semester	from October 14th, 2024	to November 14th, 2024

MANDATORY DOCUMENTS



TAX CODE (mandatory for all students)

It's an Italian official identification number used to open bank accounts, have an Italian telephone card, sign a rental contract, etc..

ENTRY VISA AND RESIDENCE PERMIT

(mandatory only for
non-EU students)

Students not in possession of European citizenship must apply for an entry visa for study purposes at the Italian Embassy or Consulate of their own country.

Within 8 days from arrival in Italy, they must apply for a residence permit at one of the authorized post offices.

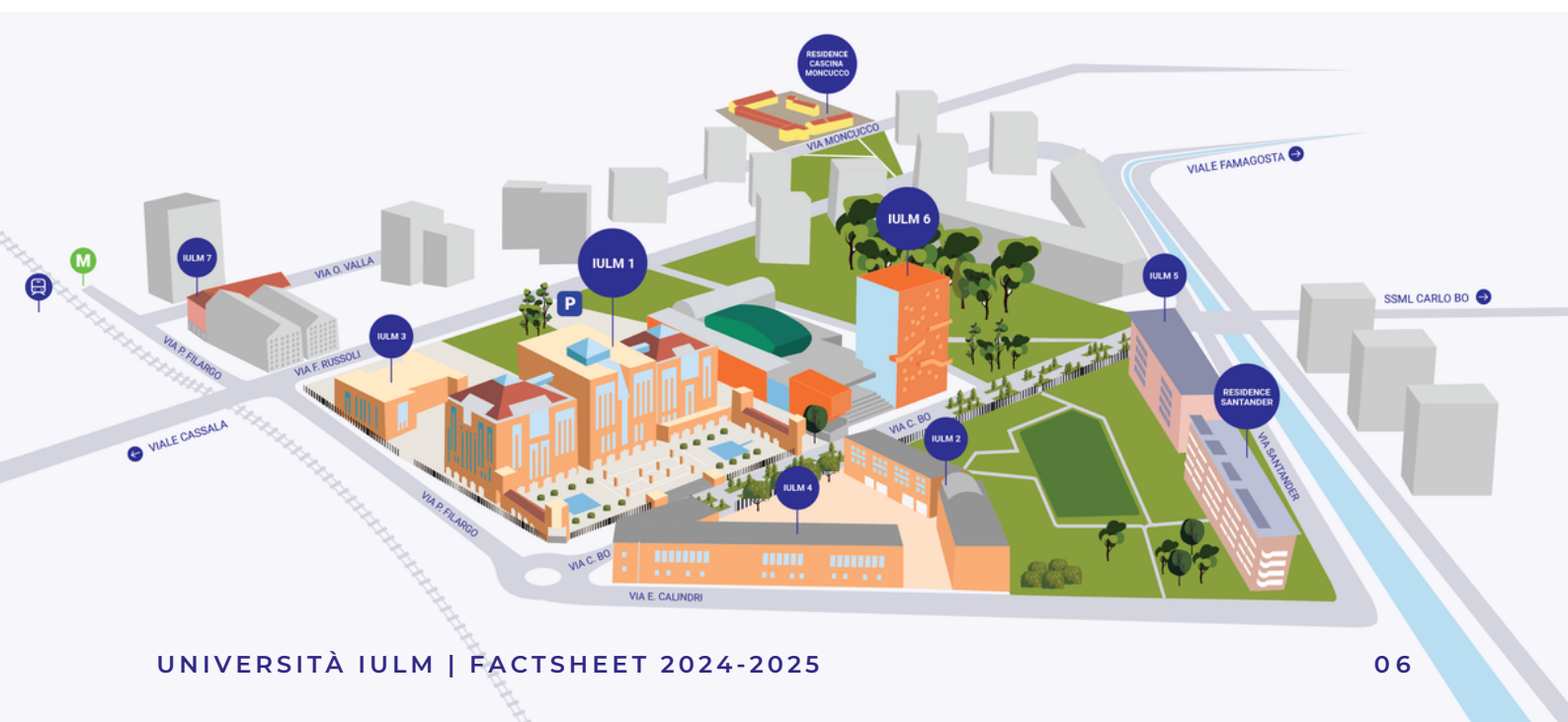

ACADEMIC OFFER

Incoming students can select courses from **different degrees** and **different years** of study, according to the language certification they possess, the semester of mobility and restrictions listed below.

Students can attend courses for **up to 30 credits per semester**.

The updated 2024-2025 catalogue will be published once available.

RESTRICTIONS

- To attend some specific **2-year Master's degree courses, capped courses** (with limited places available) or **courses with special prerequisites**, students need first a confirmation from the Study Abroad Office.
- **Undergraduate incoming students** are admitted to Master's courses only upon acceptance by the Study Abroad Office, except for 1-year courses from English-taught Master's degrees.
- The **language laboratories** from the Bachelor's and Master's degrees of the Faculty of Interpreting and Translation can be selected only by students attending a degree course in foreign languages and translation in their home university.

INTENSIVE ITALIAN COURSE

The Italian language course takes place before the beginning of each semester, in September and January/February. Students may be asked to take an oral interview to check their knowledge of the language and be placed in the appropriate level.

The course provides for **compulsory attendance** (at least 80%), which is an essential condition for the success of learning. After passing the final exam, students will get **6 credits** and a **certificate of attendance**.

The cost of the course is **€ 200** and it lasts approximately 2/3 weeks. More information will be sent to nominated students.

ACCOMODATION

Application process for Residence Santander

Incoming students can apply for a place in our university Residence Santander, which consists of **20-m2 double rooms** with private bathroom.

All rooms are equipped with 2 single beds, 2 wardrobes, 2 desks, a shelf and satellite TV. On their arrival, students will receive sheets and blankets.

In the common areas of the Residence there are a TV room, a computer room with Internet connection, a coin-operated laundry.

The rent is **€ 450/month/person**, to be paid at the beginning of each month, plus a **€ 500 cautionary deposit** to secure the booking. Deposit will be refunded back after departure.

Places are very limited and we usually have a huge number of requests, so getting a room is quite difficult.

Students who complete the Application Form for their mobility will receive by email all the instructions to apply also for a place in the Residence Santander.

The residence Application Form will be open for 1 week:

- 1st/Fall semester = **from June 14th to 20th, 2024**
- 2nd/Spring semester = **from November 15th to 21st, 2024**

Students will receive a confirmation email of room availability by the Study Abroad Office some days after the form is closed, together with all the information about payment deadlines.

Can students take courses belonging to Bachelor's or Master's degrees different to their Major at home university?

We always suggest to firstly stick to degrees similar to their study path in their university. If needed, students can also select courses from other degrees, paying attention to the column of Restrictions in our Course Catalogue.

Can students take IULM exams online or at their university?

IULM exams are taken entirely in presence during exam sessions scheduled in the academic year. Students are tested face to face.

Can students do an internship during their mobility?

Only during their mobility, students can benefit from the help of IULM Career Service to find an internship in Milan. They can obtain 3 credits from the internship. Please note that finding an internship for incoming students can be challenging, especially if they don't master Italian language.

When will classes' timetables & exam schedules be published?

Classes' timetables are usually published some weeks before the start of the semester, while exam schedules are published one and a half month before the exam session.
