Application process:

1. Once nomination has been received, the relevant college or school will send the student a link to the online application form.
2. The successful applicant will receive an offer letter and a student ID number. All additional information will be sent to the student's email address which has been provided in the application form.
3. The student can apply for accommodation with their student ID number which will be included in the official offer letter.

Postgraduate students

Please only nominate Undergraduate/Bachelors students unless we already have an agreement for Postgraduate / Masters students.

If you nominate a postgraduate student for our Undergraduate / Bachelors courses they will be rejected unless specifically allowed for in a partnership agreement.

School of Health and Care

Clinical placement nominations will only be accepted from partners with whom Coventry University has an explicit arrangement as evidenced in the institutional Erasmus/Exchange agreement. Nominations without this pre-existing arrangement will be rejected.

College of Business and Law

Students nominated to the College of Business and Law will need to select one of three designated pathways. These are the only modules which will be open to exchange students in the 2025/2026 academic year.

Please note that if you are nominating a student for College of Business and Law, teaching occurs on the Coventry campus only.

College of Engineering, Environment and Science

Students will be able to choose one course from the list of courses within the College of Engineering, Environment and Science when completing their application. Students will then follow our pre-existing route for the course and will study the 3 modules that are running in that semester. For example

	if students choose the Mechanical Engineering course they will be allocated onto the modules within that course. We cannot accommodate module changes from the course allocated modules. <u>College of the Arts and Society</u> School of Social Sciences and Humanities: Students joining this school are NOT allowed to mix and match modules from the available courses. You will need to select the course that you would like to study (for example, International Relations) and the year that you would like to join (for example, year 2), you will then follow the modules (subjects) on that course. <i>**Students studying; Psychology, Criminology, Childhood, Youth and Education Studies and Forensic Investigation have the opportunity to select modules from a different subject where there are not sufficient credits to complete the semester.</i> School of the Arts and Creative Industries: Students joining this school are NOT allowed to mix and match modules from the available courses. You will need to select the course that you would like to study (for example, Media Production) and the year that you would like to join (for example, year 2), you will then follow the modules (subjects) on that course. <u>Coventry University London</u> Students can only choose one option for each semester. Each options consist of 3 modules. Students cannot mix & match the modules. Module selection can be found here. Please note: It is not possible to combine modules from multiple years, courses or schools due to timetable clashes. If you are here for one semester only, you will only be able to choose modules available during that specific semester. Please note modules and timetables are subjects to change.						
Can students combine courses from different Colleges?	Students cannot mix courses from different colleges. For example, the BA Business course and the BA History course belong to two different colleges and therefore cannot be combined.						
Can students combine courses at Undergraduate / Bachelors and Postgraduate / Masters level?	No, unfortunately the two cannot be combined.

What are the course requirements?	<u>English Requirements</u> B2 Level of English is required. For one semester students, this can be confirmed by a letter from the						

	student's home university. The letter needs to state that the student has achieved B2 or higher in all four components (Reading, Writing, Listening and Speaking). The letter must be: • On Letter headed paper. • Provides contact details for institution. • Dated. • Signed and stamped by the home institution. <i>**Letters that do not state language competency in all 4 components (reading, writing, speaking and listening) will not be accepted.</i> For students coming for the full academic year, the students need to provide evidence that they have passed an English language level test. The following tests are acceptable: • Pearson PTE • TOEFL 79 with minimum of 18 in all areas • British Council Take IELTS 6.0 overall with a minimum of 5.5 in all areas • Online English language Test OI Digital Institute • LanguageCert Language Exams & Certifications • Cambridge: 170 overall with a minimum of 160 in all areas <u>Prerequisites</u> Some courses/modules may require prerequisites; the requirements are clearly stated on the course and module information sent to students.
What are the visa requirements?	Students will need to adhere to the relevant immigration requirements for a UK visa which may differ from our minimum requirement. For further guidance please click here. <u>Visa options:</u> 1. Standard Visitor Visa allows students to come to the UK for a short period of time (up to 6 months), such as to participate in an exchange programme. Some nationalities will need to apply in advance for a Standard Visitor Visa. You cannot extend a visitor visa nor switch into a different visa category in the UK while on a Standard Visitor visa. Visa required depends on students' length of stay. Students nominated for

	Semester 1 only will not be able to extend their mobility to Full Academic Year. If you have any students that you are planning to nominate for Semester 1 only that might want to extend their stay, please inform both the Study Abroad team and relevant College by 23rd May 2025 as any extensions (from Semester 1 to Full Academic Year) will not be possible after this date. If the student has Settled/Pre Settled Status, the student is not required to have a visa to enter the UK.
Grading system:	Percentage 0-100% CAT Credit System (1 ECTS = 2 CAT Credits)
Attendance monitoring	Please note: All students' attendance will be monitored, and all students on the Student Visa route will have attendance/engagement monitored by the International Student Compliance Team (ISC), to ensure they remain compliant with UKVI regulations and visa conditions. Please be aware that you cannot extend your study period (from one semester to full academic year) after your application is completed. For Incoming Students: You will need to complete a 'Right to Study' check on arrival in the UK, before you can enrol on your course. This will be carried out by the ISC team who will contact you prior to enrolment to guide you through this process.
