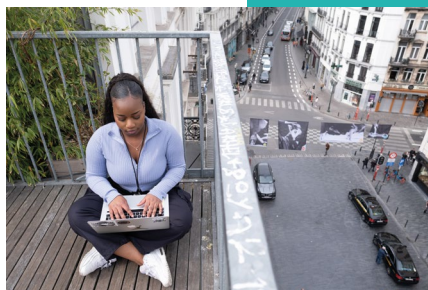

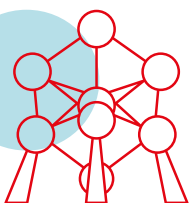

Facts & Figures about Brussels

Brussels is not only home to the headquarters of the European Union, but also to NATO (North Atlantic Treaty Organization) and over two thousand multinationals. While the city is very vibrant and cosmopolitan, it also has a village-like vibe to it. Each district has its unique character and the city has a way of making everyone feel welcome, with a chill atmosphere and locals who do not take themselves too seriously.

Some of the better known neighbourhoods are Matonge (where you can get a taste of Central Africa), Marollen (check out their daily flea market), the European district (go there for after-work drinks on Thursdays), Louizalaan and Guldenvlieslaan (two big shopping avenues), Zavel (with its more luxurious boutiques, food shops, and antique market), Laken (go there to visit the royal gardens) and Heizel (where the Atomium is located).



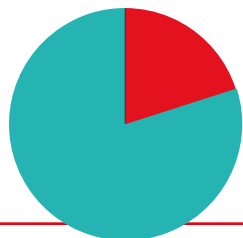

Brussel Brost is a free student festival kicking off the academic year in Brussels! The festival is organized on the last Thursday of September and allows the students to dance their way into the new academic year.



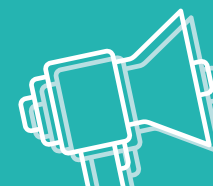

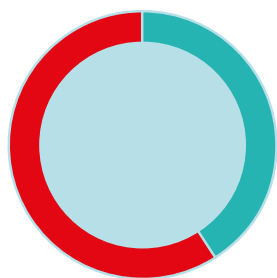

Landscape and Garden Architecture

Landscape architects design gardens, green and urban spaces and landscapes, in a sustainable and climate-conscious way. To train our students, we use design and research as creative standards for developing conceptual, implementation-ready or policy-based design proposals. We teach students how to organise and design both natural and man-made elements using scientific and intuitive means. The outcome of any project, regardless of scale, must meet the requirements of usability, spatial and visual quality and sustainability. You will not just learn to design in a studio. During our workshops, you will get to work on projects and real cases. We would like to invite you to participate in these projects. You can also combine your exchange study programme with a traineeship in the following semester.

Idea and Innovation Management

The package of courses (amounting to a possible totality of 30 credits) is specially tailored to allow incoming international exchange students the opportunity to obtain a flavour of the programme, of innovation in a broader Belgian context, and of expanding their professional network. Upon return to their home institutions, students will feel empowered with new knowledge, new experiences, new approaches to existing (world) problems, and an overall sense of innovative completion.

Incoming international students will also partake in the annual 2-day visit to the world-renowned Dutch Design Week in Eindhoven (the Netherlands), usually in the last week of October. Aside from exploring the exhibitions, workshops, seminars, and events organised by the Dutch Design Week itself, students will have the opportunity to apply course-taught information through course tasks.

It is equally possible to combine the exchange study programme with an internship and apply for a full academic year!

Transdisciplinary and Education Programmes

Come and discover how you, as an educator, social worker, (pedagogical) coach, and pedagogue,... can use the multicultural and metropolitan context to enhance the lives of children and youngsters in a super-diverse city.

Through practice-based projects and internships, you will get a closer look at the diverse reality of Brussels. You will encounter a broad range of organizations in the field of education, welfare, family support, culture, and youth. The voice and perspective of children, youngsters, and educators working in the field will be the guiding force throughout the programme.

Wandering through the metropolitan city of Brussels you will be immersed in cultural education and learn the importance of public perception, qualitative interactions, multilingualism, and coaching, all the while focusing on 21st-century skills. Skills that will give you the ability to respond innovatively and creatively to this ever-changing world.

The three courses offered in our teacher training and educational programmes are: Early Childhood Education and Care, Pre-primary Education and Primary Education.



Audiovisual Arts and Drama at the RITCS | School of Arts

The Royal Institute for Theater, Cinema, and Sound - School of Arts, in short RITCS, offers courses open for student mobility in the fields of Audio-visual and Dramatic Arts. Teaching at RITCS is organised around several specialisation areas which are taught from the Bachelor level to the Master level. With our international exchanges, the multicultural actors and the Brussels metropolis as a cherry on the cake, our training generates a window onto the world.

The language of instruction is Dutch, with facilities in English for international students. As the groups are quite small, you can easily catch up and fellow students are there to help you. Incoming students take part in Dutch courses so it is strongly advised to follow the Survival Dutch course or take Dutch classes.

We will have a personal interview with you online in order to get to know each other and to screen your motivation, CV etc. Upon acceptance of your application, we will guide you to create an adapted study programme.



Music and Musical

The Koninklijk Conservatorium Brussel (KCB) is a School of Arts of EhB. At the KCB we focus on the dialogue between the past and the present. An international team of renowned professors is there to coach you and develop your skills so that you can discover what you are truly capable of.

Exchange is possible within:

- the Instrument/voice branch with its unique Historical Instruments (HIPP) department
- the field of composer or conductor
- the programme in Jazz and/or composition and arrangement.
- the Musical programme

The programme is individualized and dependent on the number of places available. We therefore ask all students interested in becoming an Erasmus student at the Koninklijk Conservatorium Brussel (Royal Conservatory of Brussels) to apply electronically and simultaneously send us the AEC application form as well as a cd or DVD with a demo or a portfolio of your compositions (for students in composition and writing).

How to apply?

Erasmus+ Study

1. Preliminary steps at your home institution

- Your home institution needs to have an inter-institutional agreement with Erasmus Brussels University of Applied Sciences and Arts. Check if this is the case by consulting with your home institution's International Office.
- Follow the application process at your home institution to be nominated as a participant in the Erasmus+ programme.
- A B2 CEFR reference level in English is required. Check with your home institution and verify that you have reached this level.

2. Get nominated by your home institution

- Once you pass the application process at your home institution, they will officially nominate you by notifying us.
- The deadline for them to do so is April 15th for exchanges in the Fall Semester and October 30th for exchanges in the Spring Semester

Students applying for The Koninklijk Conservatorium Brussel (KCB) or The Royal Institute for Theater, Cinema, and Sound (RITCS) should also take into consideration the additional application procedure at these two Schools of Arts. Please consult their website or contact them directly for more information.

3. Registering with EhB – Mobility-Online platform

- Once your home institution has officially nominated you, we will send you the required information to register electronically through the Mobility-Online platform.

4. Completing the Learning Agreement in Mobility-Online

- Contact the academic Erasmus coordinator of your field of study (contact details are on the programme webpage) to define your academic exchange programme.

- Write the details down in a Learning Agreement:
 - If your home institution works with an Online Learning Agreement (OLA), you will have to fill out your courses on your home institution's platform. Your OLA will be sent to us automatically after they have approved it.
 - If your institution does not work with an Online Learning Agreement, you can upload your Learning Agreement as a PDF document on Mobility-Online.
 - The deadline for either type of Learning Agreement is one month before the start of your exchange.

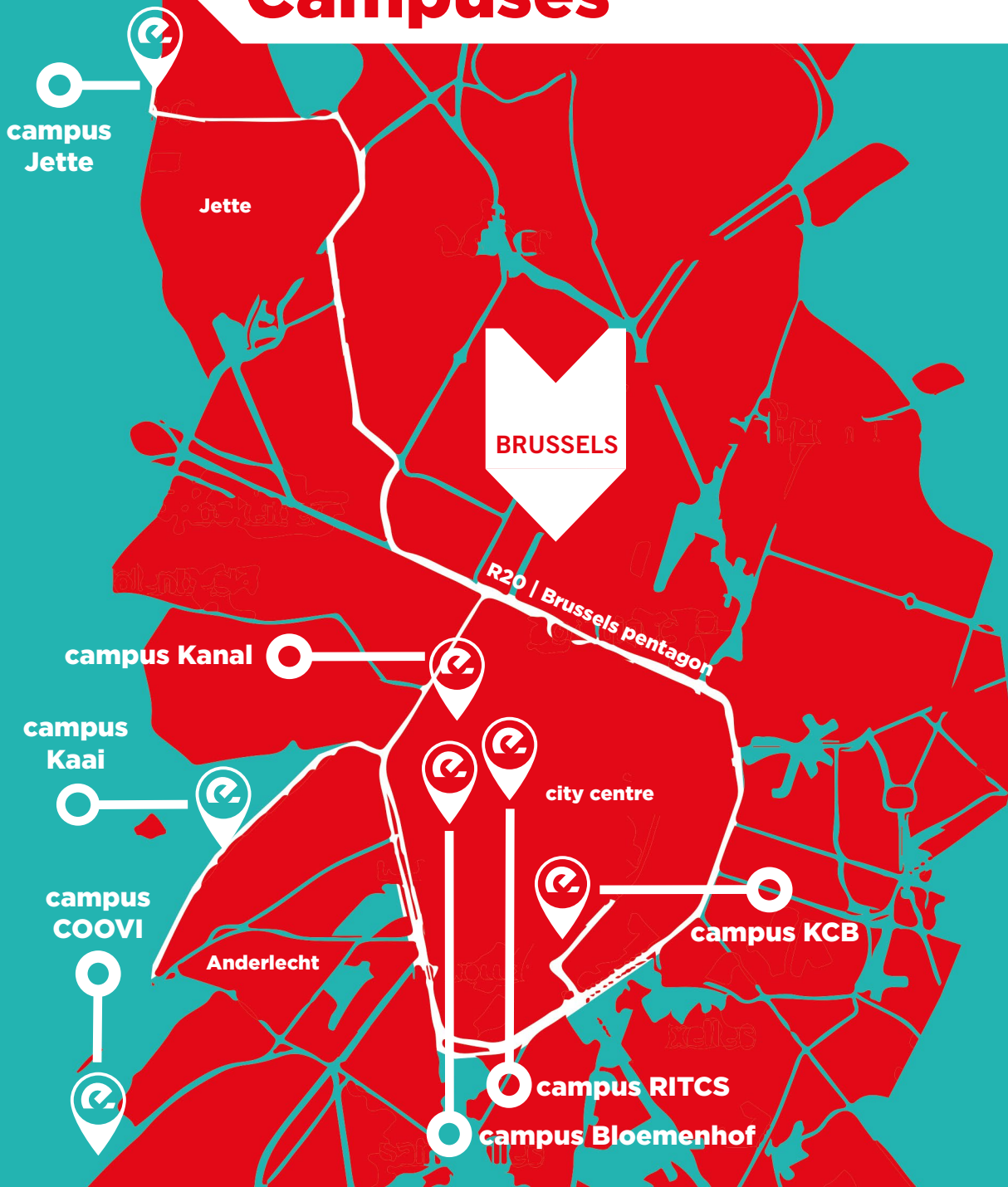
