ZHAW School of Life Sciences and Facility Management (LSFM), Wädenswil

Wädenswil is a small town of around 26,000 people, located just a short distance from Zurich. Despite its proximity to the city, it has its own distinct identity and offers a wide range of activities and cultural events. Situated on the left bank of Lake Zurich, close to a variety of leisure areas, it is an attractive place to live and study.

The School of Life Sciences and Facility Management in Wädenswil is one of the leading centres of expertise for food, health, society, and the environment. Its researchers are actively involved in international networks in these fields and frequently participate in EU projects. Exchange students from all around the world profit from its attractive study programmes and summer schools.

Depending on their nationality, visitors are subject to different entry requirements. All international students are required to register with the Residents' Registration Office within 14 days of arrival. Students intending to work must obtain a work permit. The recommended language level is B2 for bachelor's programmes and B2+ for master's programmes. The international coordinator at the home university is responsible for confirming the required language proficiency.
